ACTING

A101 - Acting for Adults: *This is an introductory class in acting designed for those interested in the performing arts. This class provides a basic insight to the dynamics of acting within a supportive environment. You will learn improvisational skills as well as character development and how to analyze a scene.*

A103: - PlayWrite! I: *In this class students will be discussing the classic themes and structures that are used in playwriting and development. The work can be a comedy, a tragedy, or an adaptation of another tale. (PlayWrite Performance Class will take place Spring '10)*

F101 - Costume Design: *Learn the basics of costume design. This class touches on drawing the figure and watercolor technique which will be accompanied by exercises in each field. Students will walk away with original designs and the knowledge of basic drawing and watercolor.*

F103 - Beginners Photography: *Learn the basic principles of composition and photography, as well as how to use a film or digital camera in this five week course. F102 - Beginning Sewing: *This class will be held in two sessions. Session 1 we will learn the basics of the sewing machine and surger (Threading, Cleaning and over all care) and basic patter reading while creating a carpet bag. Students will then use the skills learned in session 1 to build clothing (PJ Pants, Dresses, Skirts) in session 2. The class will walk away with the understanding of basic pattern reading and sewing skills. (Patterns and fabric included, machines not)*

Dani Henke

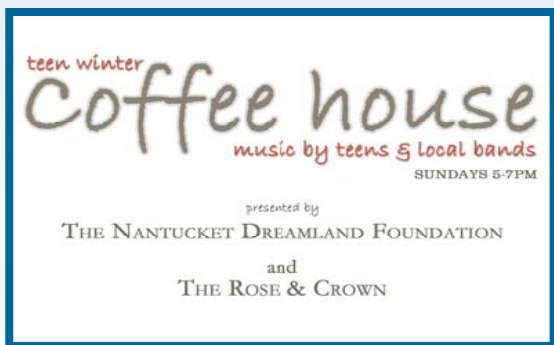

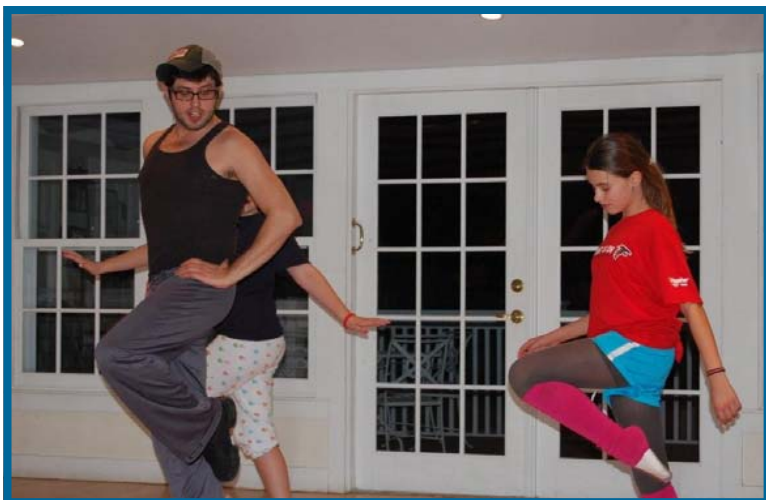
